After graduating from Elizabethtown College, Bill went to seminary, then later earned a Ph.D in church history at Drew University in New Jersey. For almost 40 years they devoted their lives to church work. Bill pastored five different Churches of God General Conference churches. They lived in many places—from Harrisburg, PA, to Findlay, OH—before settling into their current home near Bowmansville 21 years ago. Evelyn held various administrative positions in their church conference and for Diacon Lutheran Services. She also supported Bill’s efforts. 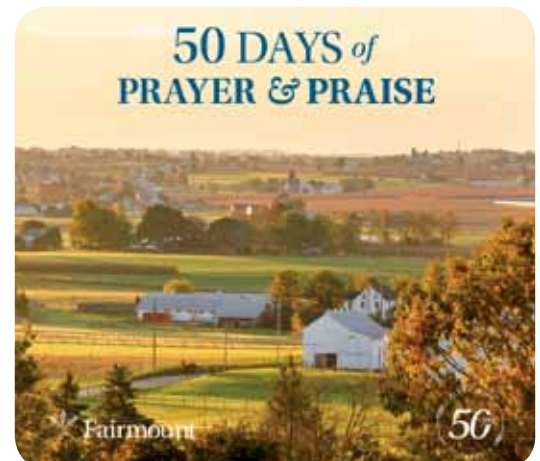

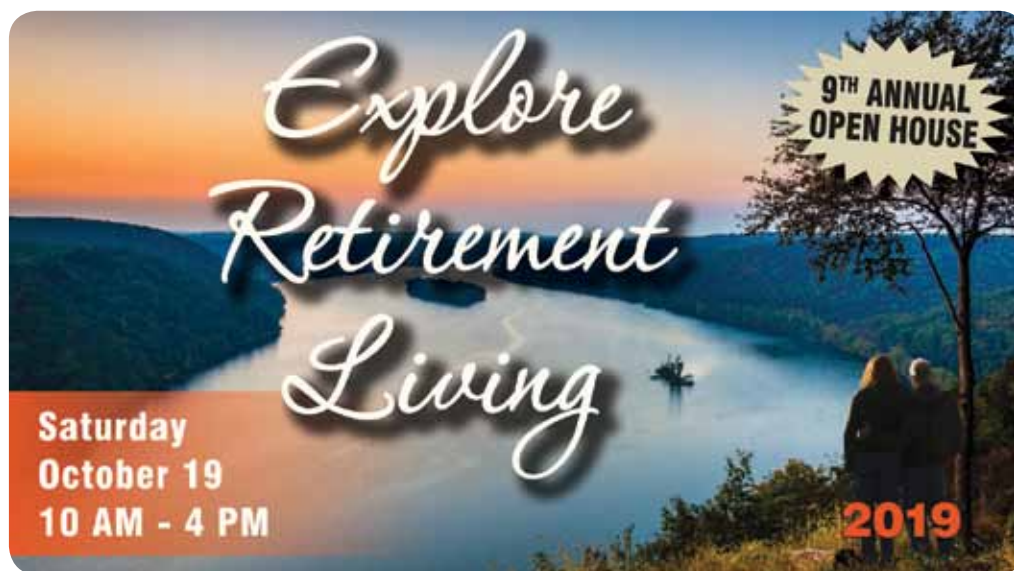
50 Days of Prayer and Praise is available at the Wheat Ridge front desk. The requested donation of \$10.50 per book will help cover the design and printing costs.
