THIRD ROUND OF HEALTH CARE UNIVERSAL TESTING

On August 12, over 200 Fairmount Health Care residents and team members were tested for COVID-19. The results are as follows:

- 212 tested negative
- 3 tested positive
- 7 tests are still pending

Two of the three positive tests came from residents and one was a team member. The residents have been moved into isolation and the team member will quarantine at home.

Three of the six residents that tested positive during the August 4 testing were discharged from isolation. Sadly, one of the six residents passed away. We are grieved that three other residents who had tested positive prior to the August 4 testing passed away this week.

The 15 team members who tested positive on August 4 (this is one additional than what was reported last week due to a delay in receiving the results) were asymptomatic and will return to work next week for their next scheduled shifts. Health Care continues to be the only area where residents have tested positive on campus.

PERSONAL CARE

We were informed this week that a Farm Crest Personal Care team member tested positive for COVID-19. That team member tested negative during Personal Care Universal testing on July 30 and last worked on July 31.
