PERSONAL CARE TESTING

COVID-19 testing was conducted in Wheat Ridge Personal Care and Farm Crest Personal Care this week. The results are as follows:

- 108 negative results
- 3 pending results
- 2 positive results

The two positive cases were from non-direct-care team members. They last worked October 8 and October 14. They will not return to work until they successfully quarantine. Earlier in the week, we learned of two Farm Crest residents who tested positive. They were transferred to our Dogwood isolation hallway to recuperate.

We will hold another round of testing in both Personal Care and in Health Care on October 21.

VISITATION

Health Care window visits in our visiting room and in-person outdoor visits will continue to be offered from 9:45 am to 4 pm weekdays and Sundays from 1 pm to 4 pm. Visits must be scheduled in advance and are limited to **one visit per resident per week** to ensure all residents have an opportunity to visit loved ones. Visitation times can be reserved online at FairmountHomes.org. We ask that you adhere to the visitation guidelines to protect our residents so we can continue to move forward with reopening safely. In the event that a COVID-19 positive case emerges among our residents or team members, we will be required to implement previous restrictions.

Visitation at Wheat Ridge Personal Care and Farm Crest Personal Care is suspended until further notice.

FLU SEASON

As we enter influenza season, please stay at home should you start experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms and notify Fairmount administration. Fairmount will deliver mail and necessary supplies to any of our Residential Living apartment and cottages residents.

For those not experiencing symptoms, continue to wear your mask, avoid large gatherings, keep safe distances from others, and practice good hand hygiene.

DOGWOOD HALLWAY ADMISSION

We admitted six new residents this week into our Dogwood isolation hallway. Two were Fairmount residents and four were from local hospitals or personal care homes. Four residents were discharged from Dogwood this week. We have cared for a total of 68 individuals in Dogwood since early April.
