Please be diligent as you are around others and take the best possible cautions. While fully vaccinated and boosted individuals who are infected may not be very sick, they can still be contagious and may not realize that they should take extra precautions.

VISITATION INFORMATION

If you are feeling well, you may continue to visit with residents. Please follow the **infection prevention guidelines** listed below. Please be aware that by visiting you could potentially be exposed or expose others to COVID-19. Additional Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), such as gowns, goggles, and gloves, may be required in certain neighborhoods while visiting.

- **Visitors may not visit** or enter the building when ill; if they were in close contact or exposed to someone with COVID-19 during the prior 14 days; if they are undergoing testing for COVID-19; or if they were diagnosed with COVID-19 in the prior 10 days.
- Upon entry, **screen at the kiosk** for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 and for a temperature check, even if you are only going into the café.
- **Hand hygiene** is essential. Use alcohol-based hand rub or wash hands with soap and water for 20 seconds. Alcohol-based hand sanitizer is available at the entrance and in the hallways.
- **Face covering or mask** (covering mouth and nose) must be on at all times.
 - N95 masks are most effective
 - Surgical masks provide protection, but are not as effective as N95s
 - Cloth masks are the least effective
- **Physical distance** at least six feet between persons.

VACCINATION OPPORTUNITIES

Obtaining the vaccine and, if you have the vaccine, getting the booster is highly recommended. Anyone who would like to obtain the vaccine, the booster, or an influenza shot, can register for one of Fairmount's vaccine clinics by contacting the receptionist at 717.354.1800. Upcoming clinics are:
