Core Values Form the Heart of Fairmount

When Janet Hibbs first toured Fairmount, she knew she didn't need to look any further. "On that first visit, I felt like I was already home," she recalls. But Janet was not yet ready for the move.

Over an 11-year span, Janet attended multiple Fairmount events and open houses until the time was right and the apartment she really wanted became available. However, her choice of Fairmount was due to far more than the right floor plan. "Fairmount is very evidently faith-based. I wanted to be around believers who enjoy Christ-pleasing activities and Christian fellowship with other residents," she says.

The sense of faith-based community that so quickly convinced Janet she wanted to move to Fairmount is not accidental. It is the result of intentional, consistent adherence to a set of biblical values. In the early 2000s, seven Core Values, each based on scripture, were formally adopted to guide all of Fairmount's actions and decisions—compassion, community, dignity, integrity, quality, teamwork, and trust. However, these values were not new. They had defined Fairmount's principles and practices from the very first day it opened its doors in 1968.

Values Guide Hiring

Keeping Fairmount true to those values starts with employing people who agree to support these commitments. Talent and Culture Manager Helen Doolittle, who guides the hiring process, explains: "Core Values are a benchmark in all phases of staffing, starting with our initial conversation with a potential employee. Our interview questions are largely based on our Core Values and are designed to identify potential staff who share our principles."

Quality Performance and Integrity

A higher-than-average staff/resident ratio is one indication of Fairmount's commitment to quality, and to maintain our high ideals, Core Values form the framework of our annual team-member evaluations.

Fairmount's determination to meet ever-changing standards and regulations for Health Care and Personal Care attests to the quality and integrity of the organization. So does the latest Department of Health survey that resulted in a report citing zero deficiencies. Our consistent 5-star rating by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid services is additional evidence of integrity across our organization.

Community Relationships

Fairmount enjoys strong community relationships. For example, we contribute to the local fire company and welcome everyone to be part of Fairmount events, such as Central PA blood drives, outdoor concerts, and seminars. Our residents volunteer thousands of hours with an impact that reaches to the other side of the globe via worldwide humanitarian organizations such as the Mennonite Central Committee (MCC), Christian Aid Ministries, Blessings of Hope and Unto.

commitment to community. In August 2021, Alex arrived from Ukraine to volunteer for a year as an assistant to Fairmount Chaplain Eugene Weaver. A seminary graduate and youth pastor in Ukraine, Alex joined this global program to broaden his experience. He joined Chaplain Eugene for Monday prayer walks, daily resident Bible studies and visits with residents across campus. Alex loves his role: "I felt very welcomed immediately. The residents like to talk; I like to listen. I learn from them and their lives. I take in their wisdom from experiences I have not yet encountered. Some residents consider me like a son."

Before he completed his year of service, the war in Ukraine had disrupted Alex's plans to return to his country. But in a true community effort, Fairmount worked with Alex to apply for a work visa which would allow him to extend his stay in the United States. As he waited for the paperwork to be processed, Alex volunteered in various departments at Fairmount. When his work visa was finally approved, he was hired by Fairmount in a department where he had enjoyed volunteering.

Compassion, Trust and Dignity

"Compassion is a very important value as I minister all across campus," Chaplain Eugene says. "And I love to observe how residents trust the staff who know and care for them."

"Dignity is realized through relationships," the chaplain continues. "Because we recognize the value of each person, valuable relationships form between
