C ider Mill Heights perches on top of a hill adjacent to the Fairmount Homes campus. The beautiful Victorian house not only stands out physically because of its location but has also become a beacon of spiritual hope and renewal. Formerly known as the Hurst House Bed & Breakfast, the property was purchased by Fairmount in 2024 with the hope of future expansion while also meeting present needs. It was recently leased to Stories Made New, a local nonprofit committed to transforming lives and deepening community connections.

Stories Made New is a Christ-centered residential discipleship program for women aged 18–35, focused on spiritual freedom and personal growth rooted in the 1963 Mennonite Confession of Faith. As part of the Anabaptist community, the program fosters healing, discipleship and transformation, providing a safe space for women to grow in faith and purpose. Their mission aligns with Fairmount's values, creating a partnership that extends Christ's compassion and strengthens the broader faith community.

By leasing Cider Mill Heights to Stories Made New, Fairmount is supporting a like-minded organization which enriches lives and extends Christ's compassion, sowing seeds of hope, faith and renewal for future generations. However, creating space for Stories Made New is only one of Fairmount's initiatives that creatively serves residents and our community. We want to share two more.
